Maz Frost, Acting head of HR for operations, Jobcentre Plus. Department for Work and Pensions

Maz joined the civil service in 1967 and her career has spanned operational delivery, HR and project work – including the implementation and roll-out of Jobcentre Plus, formed by combining the Employment Service and Benefits Agency in 2002. She started her career in HR as a staff trainer

and developed to become an internal leadership/management consultant. Max has provided HR strategic support to senior managers within the Department through periods of staffing headcount reduction; organisation design; rationalisation of support services; and, more recently, a considerable rapid upswing in recruitment.

In her current role, she has command responsibility for approximately 680 HR staff across 11 regional resource pools supporting approximately 68,000 Jobcentre Plus people nationally. Additionally Maz is currently leading the Jobcentre Plus Performance Management Project.

After obtaining an MBA from George Washington University and a Master Practitioner's degree in Neuro Linguistic Programming from London, Sunita gained over 20 years' experience building HR functions from scratch and running large scale HR transformation projects.
